SEES POSSIBLE Anti-Medical Fad TORONTO (CP) - Rabbi Abraham Feinberg said Saturday a ban on blood transfusions by members of the Jehovah's Witnesses sect could spread to other groups and develop into an anti-medical fad. Speaking at the Sabbath morning service in Holy Blossom temple, Rabbi Feinberg said the sect has an inalienable right to its religious beliefs, but suggested that Witnesses consider further study of biblical authority. "An absolutely ban on transfusions can spread to other groups and grow into an anti-medical fad. Furthermore, when a mother died as a result of the destruction of the family bond, places a moral and perhaps even a material burden on society," he said. "The biblical authors knew nothing about blood transfusions—and if they had, they probably would have welcomed them."

New York Stock Market Set New Record During Last Week

By RADER WINGET NEW YORK (AP) - The stock market last week cheered President Eisenhower's decision to run again and then advanced strongly to a record high. The Associated Press average of 60 stocks, yardstick for the market, was up \$1.70 on the week and closed at \$181.60, an all-time high mark. It exceeded the old record by 10 cents. Last Sept. the average hit \$181.50, a new high. The whole market then tumbled in a major reaction brought on by the president's heart attack. The recovery was as swift as the fall. By Dec. 5 the average again reached \$181.50. It held there the next day. Then the market began a gradual decline and fluctuated uncertainly below its peaks. A little more than two weeks ago it started a drive ahead in the expectation that the president would run again. What will the market do now? Wall street is bullish at the moment for the near-term. The further the future you get, the less bullish many brokers become. With the market only slightly above its two previous record highs, brokers look at the situation in two ways. If the market makes a decisive penetration of the old peaks, that will be exceedingly bullish. If the market fails to extend its advance with strength, that will be exceedingly bearish. The five most active issues on the New York stock exchange last week were Benguet Consolidated Mining off 1/4 at 44 1/2, U. S. Steel unchanged at 37 1/2, General Motors up 1/4 at 44 1/2, F. L. Jacobs up 1/4 at 34 1/2, and Royal Dutch Petroleum up 1/4 at 88 1/2. Canadian issues on the New York stock exchange were mostly higher on the week. Alone on the downside was Granby Mining, off 1/4 at 2 1/2. On the American stock exchange Canadian issues were mixed. Higher were Molycopied up 1-16 at 1 7-16, Furgot Oil up 1/4 at 2 and Great Sweet Grass oil up 1/4 at 5 1/2.
