New York Stocks

NEW YORK, (AP) - The stock market traded within a relatively narrow range last week on diminished volume. The daily average of trading last week was the lowest of the last two months. It came to only 1,410,000 shares daily. The daily average for the year to date is 1,759,000 shares. It was the fourth straight week that The Associated Press average of 60 stocks has retreated. Last week it lost 60 cents and stood at \$109 when the market closed Friday. There are several somewhat weighty factors hanging over the market. Defence cutbacks loom largest.

Canadian stocks were lower Friday. Dome Mines lost 1/4. International Nickel slipped 1/4 and Canadian Pacific dropped 1/4. Hiram Walker eased 1/4. Distillers Seagram lost 1/4 and McIntyre was not quoted.

Canadian issues on the American stock exchange were lower. Giant Yellowknife and Royalite Oil both dropped 1/4. Lake Shore fell 1/4.

U. S. Steel Report

CLEVELAND, (AP) - Steel magazine, after compiling statistics from steel company annual reports, says that "Now, significantly, some of the industry's principal figures are openly saying steel prices are too low."

The metal working journal's 28th annual analysis of the industry shows that 30 steel producers netted an average of 4.91 cents per lb. of sales in 1952, the lowest rate since the 5.46 in 1946. The 30 firms, Steel said, represented 55 per cent of the country's steelmaking capacity last year.

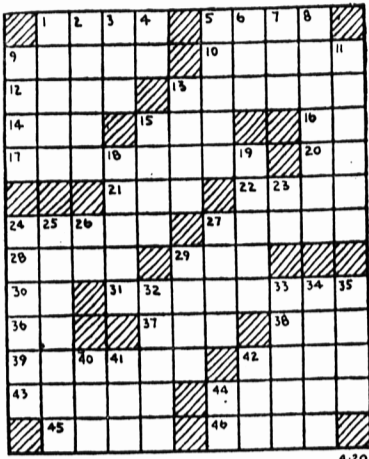
Quoted by the magazine were Benjamin E. Fairless, chairman of U. S. Steel Corp.; Ernest T. Weir, chairman of National Steel Corp.; and the annual report of Republic Steel Corp.

Fairless said the industry suffered "financial malnutrition." Since 1940 his firm's employment costs rose 155 per cent, although the price of steel rose only 87 per cent.

Weir said the industry's earnings were too low for safety and Re-
