

Wilmot Village Agreement Amended In Summerside

SUMMERSIDE — An agreement of December 22, 1965, between the town of Summerside and the commissioners of the Village of Wilmot, was amended at yesterday afternoon's special meeting of Summerside Town Council.

The Village of Wilmot had contracted with the construction firm of Curran and Briggs Limited for the construction and installation of a sanitary sewer system within a portion of the village boundaries.

Date of the completion of this project is August 31, 1967. The resolution states that "during the period between the inception and completion of the said project, a number of the customers presently using septic tank pipe mains, will be forcibly removed from their respective services, thereby leaving the customer with no sanitary sewer disposal method."
