

Tourists Spent 5 Million Dollars In PEI This Year

The Montague Junior Board of Trade enjoyed a dinner composed entirely of Island products at the Bison restaurant last night. A delicious turkey dinner was served to twenty-three members, their wives and guests.

Mr. George Fraser, director of the Tourist Bureau, was the guest speaker. Mr. Fraser spoke interestingly of the tourist trade and how it affects both the Province and the nation. He pointed out that last year tourists spent 278 million dollars in Canada, and he then presented a breakdown of this to show how it affected every business in the country, stores, restaurants, hotels and resorts, service stations and garages, plumbers, electricians, furniture dealers, farmers and many others.

These he said, were affected directly, while doctors, dentists and others were affected indirectly.

On the provincial level Mr. Fraser said that tourists were coming to the Island in ever increasing numbers, and this year approximately 100,000 visited P.E.I. and spent upwards of five million dollars.

He spoke of the many attractions offered the tourist on P.E.I., fine beaches, lovely scenery, and high standard accommodations. "However," he said, "our transportation problem is possibly the biggest headache being encountered in the expansion of our tourist trade." He discussed the ferry services at Borden and Wood Islands where, he said, some improvement would be in order.

Mr. Fraser also stated that more restaurants are needed and more seafood dishes should be served. He discussed the advantages to the farmers from the tourist trade by purchases made by the tourist resorts, and also of the large amount of wages paid out to local people from the summer's operation.

Referring locally to Montague, he said it was an ideal tourist centre, with lovely scenery, good beaches, fine fishing and ample accommodation. He expressed every hope that the tourist industry would develop to a far greater degree to benefit the Island in the even far greater measure than in the past.

Mr. Fraser also showed films of Island scenes at the conclusion of his address which was well received by his listeners.

A vote of thanks was extended to Mr. Fraser for his excellent address, an also to Mrs. Clay for the use of the dining room.
