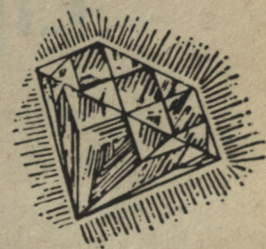
Pre-registration

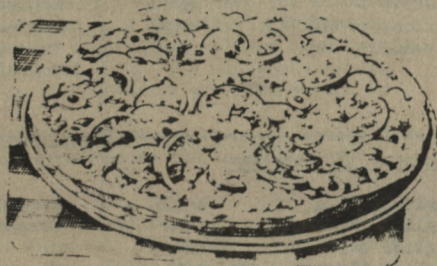
Wins Prize
