

### Director Of Cancer Control Will Study In Saskatchewan

Dr. Hooper is a native of Charlottetown where he attended West Kent School and Prince of Wales College. He received his medical degree from McGill and from 1948-51 studied postgraduate cancer diagnostic procedures in Regina, Saskatchewan. He joined the staff of the department of health in 1951.
