FINANCE BY-LAW

At the March 2, 1986 meeting of Council a Finance By-law was tabled by SU Treasurer, John Orr. It will be debated at the March 16, 1986 SU Council Meeting. The by-law is a result of the recent changes in the Constitution.

The following is a brief summary of the Finance By-law:

The general overview statement states that the Treasurer is ultimately accountable to Council for the financial affairs of the SU.

Section A is taken directly out of the old constitution

and deals with the maintenance of the bank account. Section B deals with the duties of the General Manager and Treasurer with respect to the accounting records.

Section C deals with the approval of purchases and the use of purchase orders.

Section D deals with how payroll is carried out and specifically states that Council determines the salaries and hourly wages of employees.

Section E deals with the handling of cash by SU em-

ployees. Of particular interest to many students, in light of recent problems with the sale of tickets, is the outlining of the procedure for the sale of tickets and the collection of cash.

The complete Finance By-law is available at the Student Union Office for any student who is interested. The By-law does not significantly change many of the procedures with respect to finance, but is an attempt to codify current procedures.
