NEWS NUGGETS. A Good Many Interesting Things That Escaped the Telegraph. Poreline originated in China. Most cases of deafness are curable. The German army have trained war dogs. Dutch country houses are painted with legends. Long Branch has been a summer resort for 116 years. The German army use 137,000,000 blank cartridges a year. China has four hundred million inhabitants and but forty miles of railroad. The falls of Niagara are traveling backward at the average rate of nine feet a year. Some of the largest ocean steamers can be converted into armed cruisers in thirty days. Every tree has "reserve buds" which develop at the point where the limb has been cut off. The earth's lowest body of water is the Caspian sea, which has been sinking for centuries. The Chan-San-Cruz Indians in Yucatan have never been conquered. No battle has ever been their city, which is defended by a swamp. A cab shaped like a bathtub, in which the passengers either sit or recline as if in bed, is in use in Berlin. It has three wheels and is propelled by a naphtha motor. The secretary bird of South Africa can whip any snake of twice its size. Stanley used to aver that the reptiles would crawl away from the bird's shadow in wild fear. Robbing the ostrich of its feathers is a cruel operation. The feathers are imbedded so tightly in the flesh that each quill is covered with blood when it is wrenched out. The last census of India was given with marvellous celerity and thoroughness. One million people were employed as census takers, and the huge task was done chiefly on one day, the 26th of February, 1891. Bulgarian peasants, it is said, have given up grain growing to a great extent and are engaged in raising roses, the attar of which is very profitable. Two hundred new batteries of artillery are shortly to be added to the Russian army, which will increase the number of field pieces by 1,600. Vienna has entered upon an extensive scheme of embellishment, and unsightly public buildings are to give place to new ones of artistic design. James Bragg, of Hawkinsville, Ga., trained his dog to drive a horse. While driving a team from his team the other day the dog drove it home and the owner had to walk five miles. The government of Mexico exacts a tax of \$200 on every corpse that is taken from the country. An American lady recently died there and it cost the relatives \$15 to get the remains back to her native land. Sweden is said to be the most Protestant country in the world. Of the population of 5,000,000 there are only 2,000 Roman Catholics, the remainder of the population belonging almost entirely to the Lutheran church. Held a score of the finest and oldest estates in England are for sale. The Earl of Westmoreland's 9,000-acre home in Northamptonshire may be sold by auction, although the price has fallen 50 per cent. in the last few years. Kentucky's latest freak production in the animal kingdom are a lamb with four extra legs sticking up from its back, and another that resembles and hops like a kangaroo, never using its hind feet for the purpose of locomotion. The production of oranges in Florida this year is estimated at 4,500,000 boxes, and as the Florida fruit is fast displacing the Sicilian, it is predicted that in a few years 10,000,000 boxes will represent an average crop of the southern state. The London Chronicle says that on several occasions of late a lovely lady has dressed herself up as a flower girl and sold violets in Bond street, London, in the early hours of the evening. It is now known that one of the girls was a reporter on the Pall Mall Gazette.
