

Polio Vaccination

The Salk polio vaccine works. We know that now. But how does it work?

Three Types of Virus

The vaccine developed by Dr. Jonas E. Salk consists of all three types of polio virus treated with a formaldehyde solution to make them harmless.

When injected into a person, the vaccine induces the body to produce antibodies as a defense against the invasion. We can't explain just what these antibodies are. We only know that they are small particles of protein manufactured by your body as the result of infection.

Protect Body Cells

Nor do we know precisely how these antibodies protect. In some manner, however, they appear to keep the virus from harming the body cells. Building up the antibody levels to attack the virus in the blood prevents the virus from getting to the nervous system and causing paralysis.

A few years ago, Dr. William Hammon, epidemiologist at the University of Pittsburgh, found that small amounts of polio-fighting antibodies contained in gamma globulin from human blood could confer temporary protection against the disease.

By injecting gamma globulin obtained from blood known to contain these antibodies, Dr. Hammon could confer temporary immunity to polio. But these "loaned" antibodies lost their power in from six to eight weeks.

The polio virus itself, it was known, was capable of stimulating the human body into producing these antibodies to fight it. But the polio virus, of course was also capable of producing paralysis or death.

Chemically Treated

Dr. Salk solved this problem by treating the virus with chemicals which destroy its ability to cause disease. Yet the virus still stimulates production of antibodies to provide protection.

Navy Pays Tribute To Battle Of Atlantic Dead

HALIFAX (CP)—The navy paid tribute Sunday to the 1,000 Canadian sailors who perished in one of the longest, biggest and dirtiest battles of the Second World War.

"Battle of the Atlantic" Sunday brought thousands of fuzzy-cheeked youngsters and hardened sea veterans together in prayer aboard ship at the naval dockyard and at shore stations on both sides of the harbor.

The light rain which forced cancellation of open-air services and all but one parade fell on the empty expanse of Bedford basin at the north end of the harbor where four years of war saw 2,500 ships rendezvous for the convoy lanes of the sub-infested North Atlantic.

Asks To Have Movie Banned

TORONTO (CP)—Alderman William Denison said Saturday the movie "Blackboard Jungle" is "disgusting" and he will ask the Ontario film board to ban it.

"It's too disgusting a spectacle to put before the youth of Ontario," said the alderman. He was asked to see if he could have it banned.

The alderman said the movie showed a criminal attack on a school teacher, smoking in class, drinking on the streets, car theft and the use of profanity, in portraying juvenile delinquency in a New York school.

Adenauer Party Wins Election

MAINZ, Germany (AP)—Chancellor Konrad Adenauer's Christian Democrats trounced the anti-rearmament Socialists Sunday night in an election testing the popularity of his pro-Western foreign policy.

Voters in the state of Rhineland-Palatinate gave Adenauer's party an absolute majority in the new 100-seat Parliament.

This ensured firm control of the federal Bundesarat (upper house) during the crucial period when Adenauer will submit for its approval legislation for the arming of 500,000 West Germans in the Atlantic alliance. The Socialists want West Germany to follow Austria's example and stay neutral in the cold war.
