THE BRITISH AMERICAN.

APRIL 6, 1833.

By the politeness of a friend, we have been put in possession of London papers brought by the February packet, from which we have made extracts. In the 5th page of this number will be found the King's speech, a leading portion of which is directed to the affairs of Ireland. His Majesty has promised measures of reform in the system of local (or grand jury) taxation; but has affirmed the necessity of effective measures for putting down the dreadful system of outrage and massacre lately so prevalent in that unhappy country, and calls for sufficient powers to enforce the constituted authorities and laws, and emphatically declares his determination maintain the union between the two countries unimpaired. Mr. O'Connell denounces that part of the speech having reference to Ireland, as "brutal, bloody, and unconstitutional."

"It is, indeed, but common charity says the editor of the London Times, to assume that his ire at the speech arose for its anti-repeal, not its anti-murder, spirit, and this, as seems to us, is the genuine cause to his otherwise revolting observations."
