## Increase in Late Blight Noted; Spraying Urged

There has been a gradual increase in potato late blight, the weekly potato bulletin states. In Prince Edward Island infections in trace amounts have been found scattered over the province and the same disease pattern has been noted in the western portions of Nova Scotia. So far no infections have been detected in the Annapolis Valley but several new cases have developed on the North Mountain.

The bulletin which is issued weekly by I.C. Calbeck, plant pathologist, and F.M. Cannon, associate entomologist, at the Experimental Farm, states, "we are now approaching what is commonly the most dangerous period in the growing of potatoes. In the latter part of the season moisture conditions become increasingly important in order to control them, the blight development and spread of the late blight fungus. Shower activity is often greater and a slight dew is more common. "In addition, the heavy growth of the vines this year will retard drying and maintain a high or atmospheric humidity around the lower parts of the plants. For these reasons the adherence to a sound spray program is strongly recommended."

Potato insects are not generally serious this season, it is indicated. Although aphids are present in many fields, they are not increasing to the extent of causing a disturbance in the crop. "Even though aphids are not abundant this season, they can still transmit virus diseases and it would be advisable to spray with an insecticide, such as Thiomethion, to control them, the blight development and spread of the late blight fungus. Shower activity is often greater and a slight dew is more common. "In addition, the heavy growth of the vines this year will retard drying and maintain a high or atmospheric humidity around the lower parts of the plants. For these reasons the adherence to a sound spray program is strongly recommended."

## West Prince Trade Board Against CN Abandonment

ALBERTON — Following a meeting in Alberton last night of producers and businessmen from O'Leary, Elmsdale, Alberton and Tignish, called by Alberton and West Prince Board of Trade and the following statement was issued: "We continue to strongly oppose the action of the CN Railways in arbitrarily abandoning the abandonment of a daily mixed freight, express, mail and passenger service between Summerside and Tignish and urgently request the Board of Transport Commissioners to send a public meeting on the issue."

Copies of the statement are to be sent to the Board of Transport Commissioners and to provincial and federal representatives.

Rev. David MacDonald, chairman of the Board of Transport Commissioners, said last evening that in contact with officials of the Board of Transport Commissioners, the board of the Board of Trade would be held on the 16th inst. if it was requested.

## RCN Escort Squadron Due At Ch town, S'side

The Royal Canadian Navy will carry out a pioneer movement on the province today with three frigates deploying to Charlottetown and two others to Summerside. They are units of the Seventh Canadian Escort Squadron.

The Charlottetown arm of the pioneer will be strengthened with the arrival today of the day of the United States submarine Sea Owl.

The frigates, Fort Erie, Lanark and New Waterford, will dock at Charlottetown, and the Victoria and Loch Arnan at Summerside. They will remain until Monday.

Several social events are planned for the officers and men of the ships, and a marching unit from the Canadian force, and another from the submarine will take part in the Gold Cup and Saucer parade in Charlottetown on Friday.

The ships will be open to the public for inspection at specified hours every afternoon, and the submarine will receive visitors in the tramway Thursday through Sunday.
