Premier Calls For Permanent Freight Policy

Premier Walter Shaw yesterday called for a permanent, rather than year-to-year, basis for the federal government's freight assistance policy.

Commenting on Hon. Maurice Sauve's recent announcement of a change in the policy, Shaw recommended a permanent plan.

"It is difficult for farmers to plan their feed costs when there is a possibility of changes in the federal policy," he said.

The new interim policy bases the assistance on a combination of water and inland freight rates.

"This will result in higher feed prices, particularly for milk feeds moved by rail," J. Lincoln Dewar, chairman of the seeds committee of the Maritime Federation of Agriculture, said yesterday.

The premier said the province will protest any change in the policy which could result in increased costs to producers of livestock and live-stock products.

1963-64 Incentive Program Said Most Successful Ever

OTTAWA — "The 1963-64 incentive program was the most successful ever carried out in (P.E.I.)," said Welfare and Labor Minister Henry Wedge yesterday, "despite about 1,460 men with \$6,178 man-days of work."

A total of 13 projects were approved in the island under the municipal work projects incentive program during the year, Labor Minister Allan J. MacEachen reported.

He was replying to a question placed on the Commons order table by John Mullaly, MP for Kings.

Mr. MacEachen said that 20 municipalities and 20 unorganized communities participated in the projects.

An estimated 269,424 man hours of work were required Wednesday, "including about the estimated federal share of the labor costs was \$260,000."

Generally, the projects under the program involved community improvements such as water and sewer systems, construction of firehalls and outdoor rinks and this year included, in some areas, the cutting of bushes along the highways.
