

Boys And Girls Are Trained As Tough Guerrilla Fighters

In the war in South Viet Nam, a boy is frequently called upon to do a man's job, especially by the Communist guerrillas. Kids as young as 12 have been responsible for the deaths of many government fighters. The following first of five articles tells the role of these children in the Vietnamese war.

SAIGON (AP)—Barefoot and naked except for shorts, a 12-year-old boy perched like a jungle bird atop a water buffalo, peering into the midnight dark.

He had climbed on the animal's flat back to watch a file of patrolling Vietnamese Rangers outlined against the light of the government military outpost not far away.

Suddenly he saw a Ranger draw a head on him. He turned to leap and run. A rifle shot split the midnight stillness. The boy spun crazily and pitched to the ground, a bullet through his head.

"Got the little —!" muttered the Ranger. The patrol crept ahead, a bit more hopeful that the Viet Cong would not be alerted in time to stage an ambush.

SERVE VIET CONG

The boy was a Viet Cong lookout. At 12 he already was considered a group-up in his village. One of thousands of teenagers and sub-teens youngsters serving the Viet Cong in insurmountable ways.

The lad who spied on the Ranger patrol had been responsible for the deaths of many Rangers. Each time they

had left their outpost to patrol an area not far from Saigon, they had been ambushed. Now the young lookout was dead. Another young would take his place.

The youngsters are educated from babyhood in guerrilla life, and can be more cruel and dangerous even than the seasoned guerrillas.

Hard and disciplined, they have been trained to live in holes in the ground. They have learned to regard gun-carrying guerrillas as heroes and aspire for the moment when they, too, will carry weapons.

Trap Insurance Carried By Few

OTTAWA (CP)—Out of a total of 33,192 Atlantic provinces fishermen licensed up to Oct. 14, 1964, to catch lobsters, only 143 carried lobster-trap insurance under the federal fishermen's indemnity plan.

This information was given to the Commons by Fisheries Minister Robichaud in reply to a written question by Lloyd R. Cross, P.C.—Queens-Lunenburg—Me. R. Robichaud said licences still are being issued for the current season and figures are not yet available.

In reply to another question by John E. Lloyd (L.—Halifax), who asked whether the government has considered a special insurance program for lobster fishermen for loss of catches due to storm destruction of equipment, Mr. Robichaud said the government has been unable to devise a practical program.

CONTRACT BRIDGE

QUIZ

Below are nine different bidding sequences. Where the question mark appears in each sequence, state whether you think partner's last bid should be treated as a forcing bid (compelling you to bid again), or a non-forcing bid (permitting you to pass).

1. North East, South West
1♠ Dbls 3♠ Pass ?

2. 1♠ Not forcing. A jump rebid by the opening bidder is merely invitational; responder may pass with minimum values for his previous bid.

3. Forcing. Whenever responder names a new suit, the opener must bid again.

4. Forcing. A jump bid by responder is forcing, even though the jump is not immediate.

5. Forcing. A jump shift (the combination of a new suit and a jump) by the opener is forcing. It shows 30 or more points.

6. Not forcing. This is simply an invitational raise towards a slam in notrump and has nothing to do with Blackwood. South indicates 15 or 16 points by jumping to four notrump; he is trying to find out whether or not the combined point count comes to 33.

7. Forcing. Hearts is the agreed suit. North is presumably investigating for game or slam purposes.

8. Not forcing. South indicates a hand with which he could have made a preemptive bid of three spades had he been the dealer.

9. Not forcing. South's jump to three spades over the double is preemptive.
