Integration Of Eskimo Painted To Big Problem

MANKOVIC, Labrador (CP)—Efforts to integrate the Eskimo are not always easy. This is the experience in Labrador where the Newfoundland government closed an Eskimo settlement in 1959 and sought to integrate its 300 residents into three Labrador communities.

The settlement closed was Hebron, 300 miles north of Goose Bay. Hunting and fishing were the main occupations. The settlement was difficult to supply and administer. It was decided to move the residents to Nain, Hopedale and Makkovik.

It was intended that in the consolidated settlements they would have better and more economical housing, education and health and social services. It was also intended that the Eskimos would learn to adapt to the competitive, driving spirit of the modern economy.

NOT ALL GOOD
"I must be careful what I say," said Siegfried Paul Hettasch, the gray-haired Moravian missionary at Makkovik.

ESKIMOS NOT LAZY
In Nain, 200 miles north of Goose Bay, Rev. Frederic Grubb also reported increased relief enrollment but not to the extent of the Eskimos in the more southerly centers.

Without a modern economy here the standard of living of the Eskimos is still low. The Moravian church, one of the oldest of Protestant churches, has been involved in Labrador missions since 1752 and was given large grants of crown land to take care of Eskimos.

"It was easier to guide them when we had them alone," said Mr. Hettasch. "We will have more difficulties now. We have to teach them to stand on their own feet and to make their own decision on who to serve."

TRY TO TEACH
In Nain, a determined effort is being made to teach responsibility to the Eskimos. A church collection system was introduced to teach the mission of reliance on funds from elsewhere. A "land rent" of 10 cents a year per acre was introduced to get a little money for the school.
