Nationals Need 10 Innings To Win Over 'Americans'

ST. LOUIS (AP) — Maury Wills' line single into right field in the 10th inning scored Tim McCarver from second to give the National League a 2-1 victory over the American League Tuesday before 49,936 fans in 100-plus degree weather at Busch Memorial Stadium.

The victory was the fourth straight for the Nationals, who now hold a 19-17 edge over the American League which used to dominate this mid-summer fixture. It also was the fourth straight time the Nationals won in extra innings.

Records Fall By Wayside In PEI Track Title Meet

New Brunswick athletes walked off with the greater part of honors in the Prince Edward Island AAU of C track and field championships held yesterday at Summerside in conjunction with the annual Lobster Carnival Festival.

The Oromocto Track and Field Club swept team honors handily, scoring 244 points as compared to their nearest opponents, the Kings and Queens Track Club of Prince Edward Island. Another Island entry, the Prince County Track Club took third place honors in the team competition while fourth place was captured by West Picou, N.S.

Two Oromocto opens mens competitors dominated the race for the outstanding male athlete placed fourth in the Canadian Detachment championships two seasons ago, won the award on the basis of his 28 point performance, capturing five firsts and two thirds. He was followed by Roy Washburn who competed in eight events and picked up a total of 22 points.

A Charlottetown, P.E.I. athlete, Heather MacLean walked off with the individual female honors with ease. MacLean amassed a total of 21 points and the nearest entry to her was another Charlottetownian, Frances Whitlock who had a total of 15 points on three firsts. Sheila Surette from Oromocto trailed these two with twelve points.

Records took a battering in the day-long meet held under sweltering weather conditions with no less than eighteen falling by the wayside.

John Yaus, competing for the Oromocto was one of three athletes who took two new marks. Yaus leaped 42'6 1/2" in the Junior Men's Triple Jump to establish a new mark there and accomplished the same feat in the Broad Jump where he shattered a mark with a leap of 21' 1". Young Adele Marshbank, of New Annan, P.E.I. also took two marks in the Midget Women's shot and discus. Miles MacGeough, an entry from London, Ontario and who placed third in the race for the best male athlete of the meet, competed in two different shot events, midget and juvenile, and shattered records with both the eight and 12 pound shots.

Pole vault records also took a battering as Alf Groom sailed over a height of 13'9 1/2" to set a new Lobster Carnival Open Mark and Bob Waugh took a new mark in the Junior men's vault with a mark of 10'9".
