Local and Other Items.

A TREATY MADE.—The Indian commissioners have returned from Peace River and Slave districts, having succeeded in making a treaty with 4000 Indians of the Beaver, Wood, Cree and Chippewa tribes. For rights surrendered the government pays the Indians a bonus of \$7 a head and \$5 per annum.

BLACK HAWK'S SUCCESSOR.—Thomas R. Roddy, an Irishman of Chicago, will succeed Black Hawk as chief of the Winnebago tribe of Indians. In the winter of 1897, realizing his approaching end, Black Hawk asked the tribe to name his successor and indicated as his choice, Roddy, who has been born and reared among the Winnebagos and spoke their language and that of the neighboring Chippewas and Pettomies.

NOVA SCOTIA GOLD.—One of the finest displays of gold in Halifax for many a day, was to be seen this morning at the office of George A. Pyke, president of the Richardson and Hurricane Point Gold Mining Companies. Two large bricks representing an aggregate value of nearly \$10,000 were the centre of attraction. They represented a month's work in the two mines. The Richardson contribution weighed 341 ounces, and was worth \$6,650, while that from Hurricane Point tipped the scales at 135 ounces and has a value of \$2,650—Halifax Herald.

SUBSCRIBED TWICE OVER.—The subscription lists for the two million dollars of seven per cent stock offered to the public by the recently organized Canada Cycle and Motor Company, Limited, closed at Toronto on Thursday night and the amount it is learned is subscribed for nearly twice over. Applications for shares ranged in amount from one hundred to a hundred thousand dollars and came from every part of the Dominion, the applications numbering about five hundred in all.

BOAT FOR MILLIONAIRES.—The White Star line's great ocean steamship Oceanic left London a few days ago for New York—her maiden voyage. She carries, including the 420 who form her crew, 1995 souls, of whom 375 are first-class passengers. On her speed trial the Oceanic did not make more than twenty-two knots an hour, but she is not intended to be a record breaker. In point of luxury, however, there is none on the sea like her. The suites of rooms for millionaires, according to a description in the London Daily Mail, led one to the conviction that if passengers who can pay the fare of \$900 are plentiful, it is likely they will patronize the Oceanic.

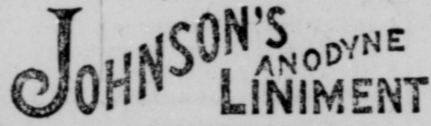
