

Band Of Indians Rescued 7 Montrealers From Death

MONTREAL (CP)—How a band of Algonquin Indians, coming to the rescue in canoes, saved seven Montrealers from drowning in a lake 275 miles north of this city was relayed Thursday.

The rescue was carried out last Sunday by the Indians, who lived on an island in the lake and skillfully manoeuvred three canoes in saving all seven.

"Seven of us from Montreal, along with two American guests, had been fishing in Lac Desoix, south of Val d'Or," said Jack Bernstein. When it started to rain we pulled to shore to wait it out. But some of the party became so wet and could we figured we could skirt the rushing waters below the Borque dam, missing the turbulence from the open sluces. We wanted to get across the neck of the lake in our three flat-bottomed boats.

"Three of the fellows started first. Their motor conked out and

their boat was swept into the rapids and upset. They were carried away in the frigid water.

BOTH UPSET

"So two of us then set out in a second boat to save them. But we got caught, too, and our boat started shipping water. The third boat followed us but didn't get far before it was caught broadside and sank just as it reached our boat.

"The two in it were able to jump into our boat. By this time the three fellows from the first boat were hanging to the side of our half-filled boat. The load was too much and we rolled over.

"We were all in the water, fearing the worst. Jack Salzman, my

neighbor, was in a pretty bad shape. Then, like a miracle, three Indian canoes appeared, in perfect formation. A young and an older Indian were in each canoe.

"They came from an Indian village on the island. They wouldn't pull any of us out until the three canoes were in position so each could steady the other. Then suddenly we were all on our way to the village."

The Indians, headed by Chief James Quable, are guides in the summer and trappers in the winter, said Mr. Bernstein.

The rescued men have given \$500 to the village, where 10 families live, and plan to make contributions of clothing and food.

Census Shows Charlottetown Has Population Of 16,446

OTTAWA (CP)—Some of Canada's smaller cities are keeping pace with the big centres—and at times surpassing their rate of growth—in the country's steady population rise.

Saskatoon, for instance, increased its population by 33 per cent in the last five years up to last June 1. Drummondville, Que., had a population gain of 84.2 per cent, Regina 24.5 per cent, Fredericton 12.6 per cent and Little Prince George, B.C., 121 per cent.

That was the picture drawn today by the bureau of statistics in a further interim report on its census taken last spring—the first national count ever taken on a five-year basis. Previously the census was made every 10 years.

Today's report was only a partial list of Canada's communities. The final tabulation is expected to show the country's population at or near the 16,000,000 mark, compared with 14,000,000 at the 1953 census.

Saskatoon increased to 70,843 persons from 53,268; Drummondville to 28,424 from 14,341; Regina to 88,787 from 71,319; Fredericton to 18,027 from 16,018 and Prince George to 10,395 from 4,703.

Coconut Palms Menaced By South Pacific Beetle

AUCKLAND, New Zealand (CP)—A beetle has replaced all other pests as the greatest menace of the South Pacific. The reason is that it attacks the coconut palms which have always been the life blood of the islands.

Cocooned palms provide food, drink, building materials and a hundred products in daily use in the Pacific islands. In addition the died flesh from the nuts, copra, is the chief export from many of the islands.

A HORNEDE BEETLE

Now this vital tree is threatened through the depredations of the rhinoceros beetle. So called because of the rhinoceros-like horn on the top of its head, the beetle eats its way into the palms, and kills them.

Other Pacific islands have stepped up their precautions in an effort to ward off an invasion of the rhinoceros beetle. Travelers flying from one Pacific island to another find their baggage meticulously inspected by customs officers—not in search of contraband but as a check against a beetle having lodged in the cases.

A heavy growth of brown hair covered the forehead of the seven-year-old heir apparent down to near his eyebrows on his return Tuesday from a long holiday in Scotland.

People noted it as he drove through London to Buckingham Palace with his mother, the Queen, and his younger sister, Princess Anne.

The Daily Express remarks that the prince's hair was even closer to his eyebrows than usual. "Not one photograph of him has ever revealed his forehead," it says.

The young prince gets his hair cut for four shillings, six pence from a barber named Crisp, who calls every two weeks at Buckingham Palace. Crisp works out of an establishment in Curzon Street named Trumper's.

"We never discuss the heir's hair," Trumper's announced when prodded for a professional description of the style.

But another barber said Charles' hair looks the way it does because it has been styled strictly "with scissors and comb and not just taken off with clippers."

"That's what I call a good, utilitarian style," he added. "Most boys have hair growing naturally this way, but their parents seem to think they look neater with the front slicked back."
