For The House Wife

Beefsteak and Kidney Pie Recipe

1. Wipe meat; cut into 1 inch pieces.
2. Cover bone and coarser pieces with cold water; let stand ½ hour; then heat to boiling.
3. Season meat with salt and pepper; roll in flour.
4. Fry out pieces of fat in frying-pan; brown the floured meat in fat.
5. Add meat to stock; repeat to boiling; then reduce heat and cook below boiling point until tender. Add 1 small onion if desired.
6. Soak, trim and parboil kidneys; drain.
7. Cut into pieces, season, roll in flour, brown in hot fat; add to meat and stock.
8. When meat is tender, thicken with flour (½ lb. to 1 lb. stock) mixed to a paste with cold water.
9. Season, turn into baking dish.
10. Cover with pastry or rich tea biscuit crust.
11. Bake in hot oven.
