NEW YORK, (AP)—The stock market advanced Thursday with some difficulty in quiet trading. An initial forward movement was cut back near the close.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks gained 10 cents at \$103.80. Industrial and utility components of the average each were up 10 cents while railroads were down 20 cents.

Continental Motors Corp. topped the most active list of 1-8 at 7 7-8 with 15,400 shares traded.

LOANS TO LOBSTER FISHERMEN

LOSSES FROM STORM DAMAGE, 1953

Subsequent to an agreement between the Province and the Government of Canada, arrangements are now completed to accept applications for loans to lobster fishermen of certain areas where losses of traps and gear were abnormally severe as a result of storms last spring.

Loans will be made available to fishermen operating in Lobster Fishing District 7B—from North Point along the Northern and Eastern shores of Prince Edward Island and along the Northumberland Strait shore to Victoria Harbour.

The maximum number of traps against which a loan may be authorized shall be the number of traps lost LESS 25% OF THE NUMBER OF TRAPS SET, provided that in no case may a loan be for more than 150 traps.

The amount of loan shall be that MAXIMUM NUMBER OF TRAPS MULTIPLIED BY THE UNIT VALUE OF THE traps, i.e., three dollars (\$3.00) per trap.

Application for a loan must be made on forms provided. These can be obtained from your LOCAL FISHERY OFFICER or from the Fisheries Division, Department of Industry and Natural Resources, P. O. Box 120, Charlottetown, P. E. I.
