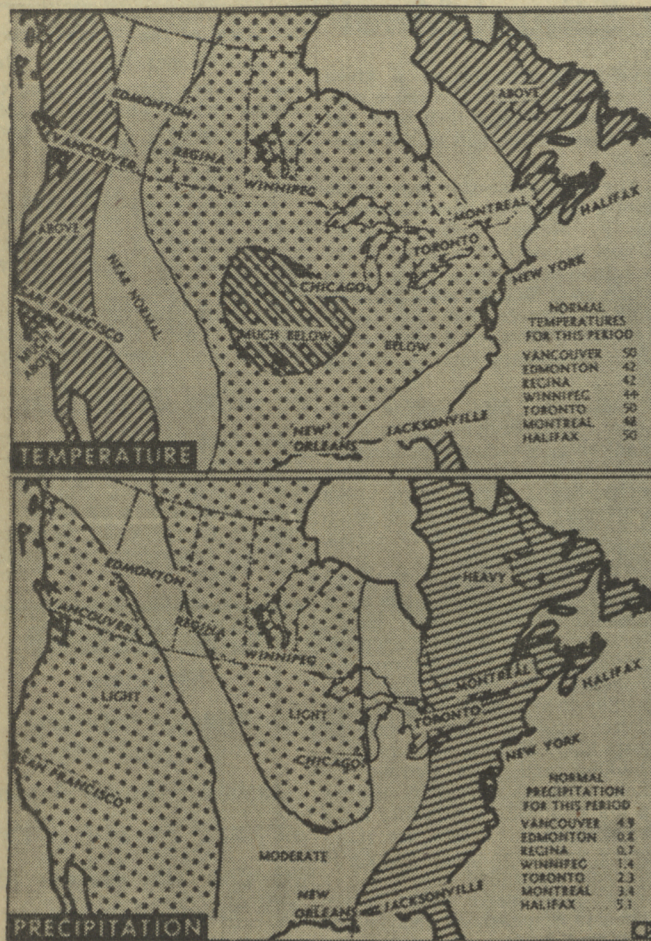

ABOVE NORMAL

Above normal is predicted for the Maritimes while most of Canada, from Montreal to the foothills of the Rockies, can expect temperatures throughout October to average lower than seasonal normals. This map, based on the 30-day outlook of the United States weather bureau, also shows that temperatures on both coasts are expected to be higher than the

seasonal levels. Precipitation is expected to be heavy from the Maritime Provinces to the Great Lakes. Rainfall is expected to be light in an area covering northwestern Ontario, Manitoba and most of Saskatchewan. Light rainfall is also predicted for most of British Columbia. (CP Newsmag)

THOUGHTS FOR OUR TIME

PATTERN OF HEROISM
When Jesus died upon the cross, He established Himself once and for all as the perfect type of Christian hero. It is this heroic spirit of Jesus which is often overlooked.
To many admiring non-Christians, Jesus is the great teacher of brotherly love, peace and meekness. To them He is remembered chiefly as the author of the beatitudes; blessed are the meek, blessed are the peacemakers.
But He is much more than this. He is also the author of: Greater love than this no one hath, that a man lay down his life for his friend — a saying which He supported with His own death on the cross, a sacrificial death not for friends only but also for enemies. If the word heroism means anything, surely it means this.
Jesus was crucified because He refused to compromise. As the model for every Christian, He has set the pattern for us to follow.
This does not mean that each of us must be physically crucified; but it does mean that our principles — the same principles which were His — ought to be prized above everything else and defended, if necessary, even with our life. It means that Christianity is essentially something heroic.

Christian religion, is a continuous and insistent imperative to oppose evil wherever and whenever it is found.
What both Nietzsche and Marx failed to see is the heroic quality of the Christian life when lived properly.
Christianity embraces the whole of life and is all-demanding. It has had martyrs in every age and no doubt will continue to have to the end of time. It makes demands upon even the ordinary Christian at every moment of his life, demands which in our modern world, are by no means easily satisfied.
The wonder of it is — and we may well thank God for it — that there are still so many among us, despite the pressures of a callous and materialistic environment, who continue to live a truly Christian life. Such a life, it goes without saying, often requires a real if unobtrusive heroism.
But surely this is Christianity's appeal.
In this world of compromise and timidity, of security-consciousness and "playing it safe," the clear and exciting call of Christianity sounds, appealing to all that is best in men, proclaiming in the midst of fear the militant law of truth and justice and love.

SECONDARY PLACE
For many today, unfortunately, religion seems to have lost this quality of heroism. For one thing, it has been relegated to a secondary place in our civilization as a whole and in the lives of most. It makes us appear to be "nice" people; it gives us a certain air of respectability in the community; but as far as exercising any great effect on conduct, it often falls very short.
The thought is often expressed when people are involved in some catastrophe: a man needs religion at a time like this. The implication is that the purpose of religion is to get us over the rough spots in life, to give life meaning and provide comfort when we are down on our luck, that it is a kind of subsidiary to happy living instead of the very reason for life itself.
Because Our Lord taught meekness, Friedrich Nietzsche (the German philosopher whose notion of the superman was later misapplied by the Nazis) considered Christianity to be a "slave morality."
His theory was that Christianity arose among the Jews who, being constantly under foreign domination, rationalized their inferior status in order to make life more tolerable.
His understanding
This is what Nietzsche understood by Christian meekness: if you cannot have power, make a virtue of its opposite. However ingenious such a theory may be — and it is not without psychological acumen — it misses the point of Christian virtue. And the least of the Christian saints, from the standpoint of heroism, makes the best of the supermen look like a weakling.
The view of Marx too completely misses the mark. A religion which is the "opium of the people" (a phrase, incidentally, which could best be applied to Marxism) is not worthy of the name.
It is true that religion ought to and does enable one to put up with many of the misfortunes of life, but it does so, not by putting one to sleep (the opium effect) but by awakening one to values which transcend the ephemeral sorrows of ordinary existence.
These — and unfortunately there have been all too many in the past — who would use religion as an excuse for their own spiritual sloth or cowardice in combating injustice can hardly be called religious in the proper sense. For religion, at least the
