It was just one of the many things the 34-year-old princess has had to learn in the new movie life she has chosen for herself.

She has learned that even a princess has to spend countless boring hours on the set waiting to go on for a single scene. She has learned to take midday meals out of cardboard boxes on location.

Woman Seeks An Appraisal Of Boy's Behavior Pattern

DEAR MARY HAWORTH: Just what would cause an 8-year-old boy to be self-conscious, seemingly irresponsible, and deliberately slow and grumpy when asked to do anything?

The lad is my nephew, my sister's child. He is so self-conscious, in fact, that he won't even answer if you talk to him. Or, if you do manage to extract a reply, he looks at the floor while speaking and acts very embarrassed.

His mother complains that he is "slow," but his school work is exceptionally neat and accurate. She remarks how careless he is with his toys and his money; but isn't this normal for his age?

My 8-year-old is shy at times, but she loves to talk to people.

My sister and I are quite close, having no other relatives. Our husbands both work long hours, so we practically live at each other's house; and we talk over everything that bothers us. We both would appreciate your ideas on behalf of her son, L. K.

DEAR L.K.: Your nephew's "behavior profile" (as seen through your eyes) isn't characteristic of 8-year-olds who are keeping in step with normal (or average) growth - patterns for children that age. Nor does it correspond in any detail with

appropriate self-expressive-ness in less-than-8-year-olds. As for what might cause him to be "self-conscious, seemingly irresponsible and deliberately slow and grumpy when asked to do anything," it occurs to me that you are describing (quite unwisely) a list of outcast responses.

Thus I wonder if the lad is fearfully on the defensive (habitually) against too-severely-demanding or harshly censorious attitudes, consistently beamed at him by one or both parents.

His shrinking, evasive, uncomfortable embarrassed, downward-looking stance, when you try to engage him in conversation, suggests two possibilities: One, that he is emotionally ill (as children sometimes are, in families that overlook their predicament), suffering from intense insecurity-inferiority - and guilt feelings.

Or, two, that something in your personality and manner (when you address him) fills him with apprehension, dislike, distrust or dismay.

Is it possible, do you think, that in asking my appraisal of the lad, you are anticipating a reply that will corroborate your secret (or long-held) conviction that something is seriously wrong with him?

In any case, my advice to your sister is: get first-hand help from a psychoanalyst who specializes in parent-child therapy, in diagnosing the true significance of the boy's manifestly disturbed behavior. M.H.

DEAR MARY HAWORTH: A recent critic takes you to task

for using the word "graphology" in speaking of handwriting analysis as a clue to character traits.

Your critic insists that "graphoanalysis" is the correct term of reference. Well, the critic is wrong.

Graphoanalysis is a term used only by one of the several schools - of thought in the field of handwriting analysis, namely, that founded in the USA by the late W.N. Bunker.

Another school - of thought on this continent is termed "scriptology," a system founded by K. K. Golson, Ph. D.

All systems have their roots in the European science of graphology, which has been respected in Europe for several decades.

Thus your language was technically quite correct, in citing the subject overall as graphology, instead of confusing it (as your critic does) with one particular system of this fascinating study... Very sincerely, C. D.

Devilishly Clever Way To Devil A Roast Beef

CAME a sharp purposeful knock on the test-kitchen door. Behind the knock was a pleasant-looking, alert young man, carrying an attache briefcase.

"Good afternoon, Mrs. Allen," he smiled. "My name is David Barthold. If agreeable to you, I'd like to demonstrate a gay new food product for you to taste and tell you about it. I'll need only 5 minutes."

Educated Look "You look like a college man," I remarked. "How come you are introducing a food product?"

"After I graduated from college in California, I decided to come to New York to work on a Master's Degree in history at Columbia University. I'm doing that by taking part-time jobs. Today I'm introducing a new chocolate syrup product packaged in a tall aerosol container designed to look like a soda jerk. Incidentally, that's what I am right now."

In a twinkling, David put on a soda jerk apron and cap; asked for a little space on the counter; opened his briefcase filled with props and necessary ingredients; added ¼ c. milk to a soda glass; then a generous ball of vanilla ice cream.

"Top of this comes a great big luscious shot of this new chocolate syrup from the aerosol can," he announced.

"Very nice, and done in 5 minutes flat," I remarked.

"I'll leave the syrup for you to use," he smiled, packing up in a jiffy. "Thank you very much for your interest."

MONDAY DINNER Tomato Soup with Dollops of Sour Cream Deviled Roast Beef, Pan-Browned Whipped Potato, Trio of Vegetable Salads on Lettuce Balls of Butter Pecan Ice Cream with Chocolate Sauce (from handy aerosol container) Coffee or Tea Milk Measurements level; recipes for 6

TRIO OF VEGETABLE SALADS 1 c. small - diced cooked, peeled carrots (fresh or frozen) 1 c. drained cooked, frozen, or canned green peas 1 c. drained cooked, fresh or canned beets,

chopped medium-fine 3 tsp. mint flakes 3 tsp. French dressing 6 drops Tabasco 6 tsp. mayonnaise Tender lettuce leaves This salad should be presented on individual plates.

To prepare, put each vegetable in separate bowl. Into each mix 1 tsp. mint flakes, then add 1 tsp. each of French dressing mixed with Tabasco. With fork, stir into each bowl 2 tsp. mayonnaise. Chill.

Cover 6 plates with tender lettuce leaves. On each plate in separate "heaps," arrange half cups of each of the "3 vegetable" salads. Garnish: sprigs of parsley, cress or mint.

THE CHEF DEVILS ROAST BEEF Slice enough cold roast beef or cold beef pot roast to serve 6. Brush slices on both sides with bottled sauce diable, on sale in supermarkets. Dust with 1½ tsp. enriched flour, seasoned with 1 tsp. paprika and ½ tsp. chill powder.

Fast - saute on both sides in plenty of butter or margarine. "Sauerbraten can be deviled in the same way," adds the Chef.

2 tablespoons honey 2 tablespoons frozen Florida orange juice concentrate, thawed and undiluted ¼ cup melted butter ¼ cup coarsely chopped nuts. Cut crust from top and sides of bread. Cut bread lengthwise almost through to bottom crust, then cut crosswise to form 8 cubes. Combine sugar, cinnamon, honey, butter and chopped nuts, pour the mixture over the cut loaf and bake for ten to fifteen minutes. Easy? Delicious!

Place on cookie sheet and bake in moderate oven (350 degrees) 10-15 minutes. remove string and serve warm. Yield: 6 servings.



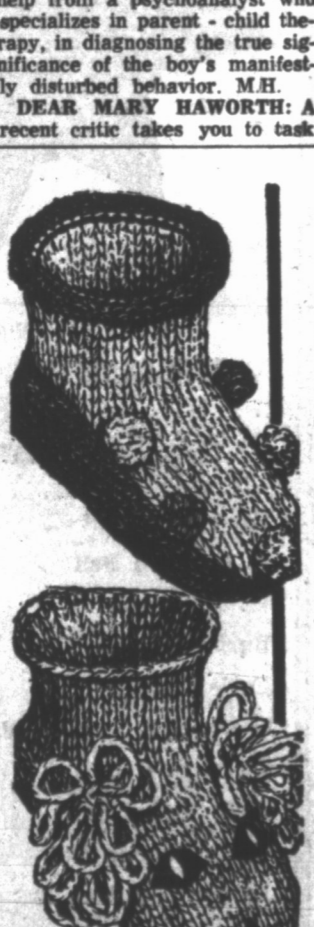
