CURRENCIES

MONTREAL (CP) - United States dollar in terms of Canadian funds off 1.32 at 97.05.

NEW YORK

NEW YORK (AP) - Reports of a switch in Russian leadership triggered so much nervousness on the New York stock market today that for a while prices took their worst beating since the assassination of President John F. Kennedy last November.

Stocks rebounded strongly from the low however, and the worst losses were almost entirely in the foreign market.

The market was lower from the start as Wall Street showed concern on the news of a change in leadership. This included the British election, the scandal involving an aide of President Johnson and a frequently expanded thought that the market was in for a "recession" of its latest rise to new highs.

News reports from Moscow, however, caused nervous selling.

The ticker tape ran as much as 25 points lower in a catalogue of selling unmatched since last Nov. 22 when it fell 27 minutes.

Losses of up to 20 points were reported in the session.

The Dow Jones Industrial average— which was off as much as 11.25 when the selling was heaviest—closed with a decline of 6.74 at 868.44.

On the day, 100 shares of General Motors was killed the average of 21.16.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks fell 2.4 to 325.17.

Industrial down 3.0, rails down 2.2 and utilities down 1.1.

Losses of a point or more were cut to fractions by some market wheel-housers as General Motors, Ford, U.S. Steel, DuPont and Eastman Kodak.

TORONTO

TORONTO (CP) - The stock market took its heaviest loss since Aug. 5, 1964, Thursday on reports U.S. Premier.

A wave of selling among industrial issues that began in mid-afternoon was checked.

Others suffered large fractional drops. Losses outnumbered gains 300 to 100.

Volume, however, paralleled that of recent sessions, indicating the sell-off was not as widespread as had been feared.

At the close, the 30-stock industrial index fell 1.75 to 164.94 and the 114-stock Exchange Index 1.69 to 154.04. Volume was 2,765,000 shares compared with 3,064,000 Wednesday.

The decline set in soon after reports swept the financial community the premier had resigned.
