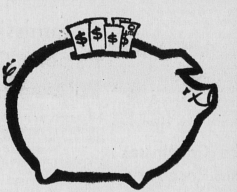

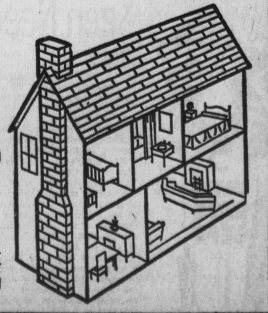

Remodeling of Souris Rink Nears Completion

SOURIS — The repair and remodeling of the Souris rink is nearly completed.

A new promenade has been constructed and new floors have been put in the dressing rooms. The caulk has been re-remodeled and will sport a new interior and a new door.

Painting of the promenade, walls, beams and the dressing rooms is nearing completion. The heating system has been converted from coal to fuel oil.

Anglican Church Revises Hymnal

LONDON (AP)—The Church of England, in revising its hymn book, is dropping Nearer My God to Thee.

It was considered "doctrinally vague," said Arthur Pollard, a lecturer at Manchester University who was literary adviser for the revision.

There is a legend this hymn was sung by passengers aboard the sinking ocean liner Titanic in 1912.

Also dropped is I Want to be Like Jesus.

"The first line's enough, don't you think," Pollard said.

The hymn contains 663 hymns including 20 new ones. The words themselves are retained, but the hymn changes what the committee in charge describes as obscure or unfortunate words. New music or harmonies are supplied for some hymns.

The book will be published in 1966 and distributed throughout the Anglican communion except in North America where copyright considerations are involved.
