OTTAWA (CP) — Federal labor department officials will confer in Montreal today with both sides of the railway-union contract dispute in an attempt to get agreement on the terms of reference for an arbitrator.
WASHINGTON (AP) — Two indictments charging Joseph E. Casey, former Democratic congressman from Massachusetts, with conspiring to defraud the government in surplus ship deals were dismissed Thursday in U.S. district court here.
MONTREAL (CP)—Prime Minister St. Laurent said Thursday "politicians in Quebec province can not stop Canada's development nor the expansion of the federal government's influence.
EDMONTON (CP) — Food supplies have been flown to a band of nomad Eskimos found starving in the Northwest Territories, 230 miles inland from Hudson Bay and about 50 miles north of the Manitoba border, it was learned Thursday.

TORONTO GOES WILD
Across Canada millions more pulled for success of the fourth-form high school student from suburban New Toronto, Newspapers put out special editions and radio stations kept the air busy with progress reports.
The estimate of \$50,000 in prizes was made by an official of the CNE, which itself will give Marilyn \$7,500. She is assured of at least \$3,000 more in money prizes already promised and rumors of further large gifts flooded Toronto as merchants and sportsmen hurried to recognize her outstanding endurance.
The Toronto Maple Leaf baseball club tried to reach her by uniform and under complete military control and discipline.

He noted wide fluctuations in the number of civilians in the army during the last 15 years, adding that "good career opportunities would afford any feeling of insecurity."
"Too little thought and attention has been given to the career of civilians within the services," he added, although the situation was expected to improve in the next two years. A senior personnel officer to the army has been appointed by the civil service commission to study the problems.
"A wide variety of reasons were given by those leaving," he said. "These included too little pay, a dislike for army procedures, working conditions and particularly the location of army installations."
