#### HENRY AUSTIN BURDETT

In the late afternoon of July 26th the residents of Strathcona and surrounding districts were shocked and saddened to hear that Henry Burdett, while at work, had been suddenly called to his eternal home.

The late Mr. Burdett was born in Strathcona in November, 1870, the son of William and Mary Burdett. He was a man of pleasing and cheerful personality, highly esteemed by all who knew him.

He had been an elder in the Dundas Presbyterian Church, afterwards the United, and was in his usual place in the sanctuary the Sunday previous to his death.

The funeral, which was a very large one was held on Friday, the services in the home and at the grave being conducted by the pastor, the Rev. D. S. McLeod, assisted by Mr. Hinnett of the Baptist Church.

**BAPTISM IN GEDDIE MEMORIAL CHURCH —** A baptismal service of interest took place in Geddie Memorial Church, familiarly known throughout the New London district as "the Old Church," on Sunday morning, July 23rd at the time of the annual communion service. The two children baptized were Donald Robert Oscar MacKay and Robert MacKay Ebers. The particular point of interest lies in the ancestral connection of these two small boys, who are first cousins with the erection of the Church building in which they were baptized. The New London Church, which with Cavendish was the scene of the labours of John Geddie until he became the first foreign missionary of the Presbyterian Church in Canada when he went to the New Hebrides, was built about 1836 by James Clark. Now these two children are the great-great-grandchildren of James Clark. They are the sons of Mr. and Mrs. Cranford MacKay of New London and of Mr. and Mrs. Earl Ebers of New Jersey, U.S.A. The line of descent from James Clark is through Mr. Wallace MacKay of New London who is their grandfather. An unusually large congregation was present for the communion service which was conducted by the minister, Rev. W. Lyall Denton.
