MONTREAL (CP) - United States dollar in terms of Canadian funds unchanged at \$1.00 3/8.

NEW YORK

NEW YORK (AP) - The stock market held its own Friday as trading continued at its highest volume in a week.

The highlight of the session was a plunge in 1914 by U.S. Steel, following a proposal for recapitalization to be voted at its stock split next September.

Another feature was a strong recovery by Texas Gulf Sulphur which advanced 1/2 to 5 1/4 on 19,300 shares, making it the most active issue.

The list as a whole was a mixed affair, and the market's upward recovery of its estimate of the big increase at Timmins.

The Associated Press disclosed that 60 stocks closed unchanged at 306.2 with industrials up 5.74, railroads and utilities up 3.14.

Chrysler was second most active up 3/4 at 50 3/4 on 66,000 shares.

Do Pont fell 1/8, Royal Dutch 1/8, Republic Steel 1/8, Sears, Roebuck & Co. 1/8.

Among Canadian issues, Dominion Bridge rose 1/8.

MONTREAL

MONTREAL (CP) - Prices moved fractionally higher on the Montreal and Canadian stock exchanges.

The composite index added 0.4 to 147.2 but declines outnumbered advances 68 to 70.

Industrial trading was active with turnover at 154,000 shares, and most mines and oils were light on 378,300 shares.

The industrial index rose 0.7 to 177.3, Do Pont led up 1/8 to 5 1/4, Canada Cement one point to 47, and CIL and Moore 1/8 each to 24 and 36.

Domestic Telephone slipped 1/4 to 20 1/2.

Utilities gained 0.6 to 136.6, B.C. Telephone climbed 1/4 to 91, Quebec Telephone 1/4 to 20 1/2.

Bank stocks were active, with Dominion Bridge rose 1/8 to 27 1/2, and Canadian Pacific 1/8 to 27 1/2.

Distillers Spearhead, the main list advance with a gain of 1 1/4 to 36 3/4.

Walker Gooderham climbed 2 1/4 to 25 3/4 while TransCanada advanced the same amount to 25 1/4.

Union Gas - the company issued rights this week - gained 1/4 to 2 1/4.

Domestic Bridge gained 1/4 to 25 1/4 while TransCanada's Pipe Line was ahead 1/2 to 30 1/2.

Senior issue medicos were stronger, Comico tacked on 1/4 to 30 1/2.

State firm led stocks to 55.05, Ontario Power Corp. gained nine points profit taking late in the session.

Western issues were steady, Pacific Petroleum rose 1/4 to 14 1/2, and Canadian Delmi was ahead 1/2 to 25 1/2.

On industrial, indexes were up 3/4 to 136.53, golds 1/4 to 134.89, base metals 3/8 to 62.25, wheat.
