Bank of N. S. Reports Profit
 TORONTO (CP) - "Bank of Nova Scotia had net profit in the year ending Oct. 31 of \$4,743,800 compared with \$3,790,400 in the preceding year.

Profit was after income taxes of \$4,320,000 compared with \$3,530,000, and depreciation of \$1,78,300 compared with \$1,569,447. Total assets increased \$85,718,000 to \$1,385,000,000.

Customers savings increased by more than \$83,000,000 to \$1,200,000,000. Loans rose by some \$72,000,000 to \$891,200,797, the increase representing mainly employment of foreign currencies abroad.
