SHEEP BREEDING.

National Sheep-Breeders' Association of England.

At a council meeting of this Association, which is representative of the registered sheep-breeder of England, the following important resolution was, at the suggestion of Mr. W. W. Chapman, Secretary of the National Sheep-Breeders' Association of England, on the motion of Mr. E. Prentice, seconded by Mr. A. C. Saiter, unanimously carried:—

"That in view of the important interests involved, and of the great advantage that would accrue to breeders of registered sheep by the adoption of mutual arrangements for the transference of registered sheep from their record in one country to that of another; and also of the importance of devising means to prevent the substitution of unregistered sheep for registered sheep, etc., this Council resolves that an International Conference of Representatives of the Sheep-breeding Industry throughout the world be invited to assemble at York, in June, 1900, at the time of the Royal Agricultural Society's meeting in that city, for the purpose of considering the above, or any other questions affecting the interests of sheep-breeders generally.

"That the Secretary be, and is hereby, authorized to issue invitations to kindred societies in other countries to send delegates to the proposed Conference; but in the event there being no such Society in any country, then the Secretary shall send the said invitation to the Government Authorities of such country, asking them to nominate Delegates representing the sheep-breeding industry of that country.

"That the Executive Committee, together with the Secretary, be constituted a Special Committee to carry out the foregoing resolution."

The policy indicated by the adoption of this important resolution marks a fresh era in the history of the Sheep industry of the world, and it is only fitting that such development should have been initiated by the National Sheep Breeders' Association of England, whose pedigree registered flocks are known, valued, and appreciated through the known world.

In view of the difficulty arising from the whole of the postal addresses of Sheep Societies throughout the world not being known, we are asked to request any such society to address themselves direct to Mr. W. W. Chapman, at the offices of the National Sheep Breeder's Association, Fitzalan House, Arundel Street, Strand, London, England, who will at once give attention to any communication, and who also desires, through the medium of our circulation, to inform breeders of registered sheep that it will be taken as a great favor if they will communicate to him any suggestions or information that may, in their opinion, be desirable to bring before the said conference.

East River Steamer.

Sir,—I trust that when the navigation opens the government will give the people of Fort Augustus a steamer on East River such as they have had in former years. I hope we have seen the last of the Alameda, for I can assure you we don't want to be on the river to 1 o'clock a. m., as was the case last year.

It is not my intention to go into details and state the imperfections of this picturesque little craft. She seems to have been built fifty years ago, for what purpose I know not. For a passenger or freight boat she never was intended.

Now I say it is an insult to the people of Fort Augustus to place such a boat for their accommodation on the East River and leave a good steamer, that gave entire satisfaction in former years, tied up at the wharf in Charlottetown. But as I heard a leading Liberal express it, "Anything is good enough for Fort Augustus." Yes anything is good enough for Fort Augustus under grit rule. Still, I think our representative as we have only one in the present parliament, should have influence enough to have a good boat,—say the Southport, placed on this route once a week on Friday and not leave Charlottetown till 4 o'clock p. m., when possible. I believe this would give satisfaction all round.
