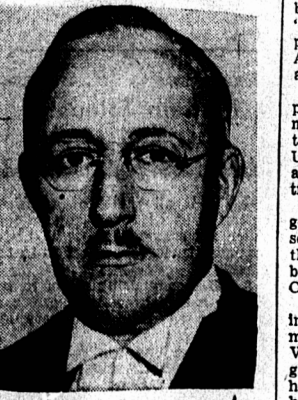

Unusual Accident On Railway Crossing

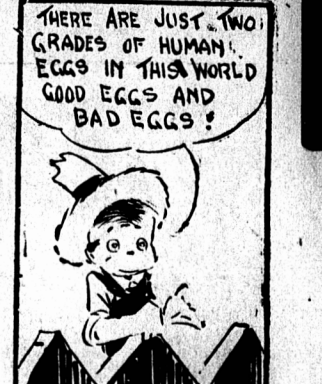
