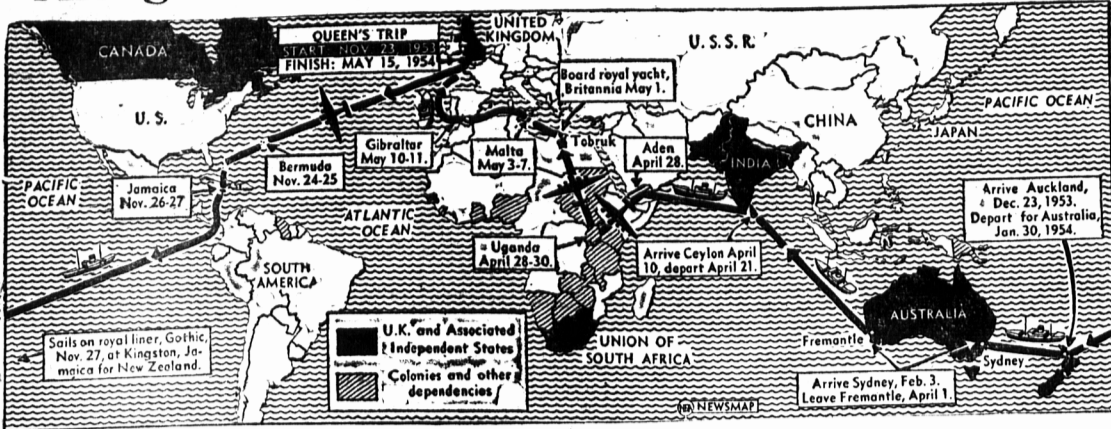


Along The Royal Tour Of The British Empire
