

# Russian Internal Troubles Are Hinted in Moscow Story

ROME (AP)—A Moscow dispatch to the Italian Communist newspaper aroused speculation here that Premier Khrushchev and the Soviet leadership are involved in serious internal trouble. The dispatch from Moscow to the newspaper L'Unita says the Soviet capital is "living in a delicate political moment." The Communist newspaper does not mention Khrushchev by name, but spoke of "grave problems" and economic failures. "Steps were taken to overcome these failures, including measures which concern the structure of the government," the dispatch says. "Yet it is difficult to say that these mea-

asures will be enough. The discussion is still open... the whole Soviet economic world is interested." Two Italian news agencies, both reflecting opinion of Italy's Christian Democratic party, report Khrushchev under mounting fire for his policies regarding Cuba, Communist China and Soviet agriculture. The Roman information agency, a small news service specializing in political reports, quotes Communist circles as saying Khrushchev recently had been put in a minority at the Kremlin by a group of opponents headed by Mikhail Suslov, member of the presidium of the Soviet Communist party central committee. The agency says Communist circles felt Khrushchev might soon be ousted. Italy, the other agency carrying the reports, says Italian Communist deputies were spreading the word that Khrushchev was facing mounting opposition and losing supporters daily.

# British Labor Party Reveals New Social Security Program

LONDON (CP)—The Labor party has announced details of a new social security plan with an "income guarantee" that would provide approximately half pay for every worker during sickness, unemployment and retirement. Because of the size and scope of the plan Labor would introduce it within the next general election, it probably would take about 10 years before it would come into full operation. But it would provide special immediate assistance to widowed mothers and old-age pensioners who, the party says, "have been suffering distress and humiliation during this decade of Tory prosperity." George Brown, deputy labor leader, told a press conference Monday that because present pensions, unemployment benefits and widows' allowances have not kept pace with rising incomes and living costs there are millions of persons who had to suffer the indignity of applying for additional help under the National Assistance Act.

**7,000,000 POOR**  
There are in Britain, he said, about 7,000,000 persons who "by any definition must be considered poor."

# Duck Laundries Being Operated

ST. PAUL, Minn. (AP)—Residents along the Minnesota and Mississippi rivers are operating duck laundries in an effort to rescue thousands of birds dying of oil pollution. The rivers are coated with fuel oil from a pipeline that burst at Savage, Minn., and soybean oil from a tank that cracked last winter at Mankato, Minn. The oil coats the bird's feathers and fills their nostrils. Beaver and muskrat also have died. Several families have picked up dozens of ducks and washed them in detergent in their own bathtubs. However, this removes the duck's natural oil coating, and the birds die of starvation. State and federal wardens and game biologists are joining in the rescue effort. University of Minnesota natural history students helped out Sunday.

**HOTEL DESTROYED**  
KINGSTON, Ont. (CP)—Fire of undetermined origin destroyed the historic British-American Hotel in downtown Kingston Tuesday. No one was injured. Fifty guests were led to safety by two nightclubs after a guest on the first floor of the limestone block, four-story structure smelled smoke and phoned the hotel desk. Damage to the hotel, built in 1886, was estimated at \$250,000.

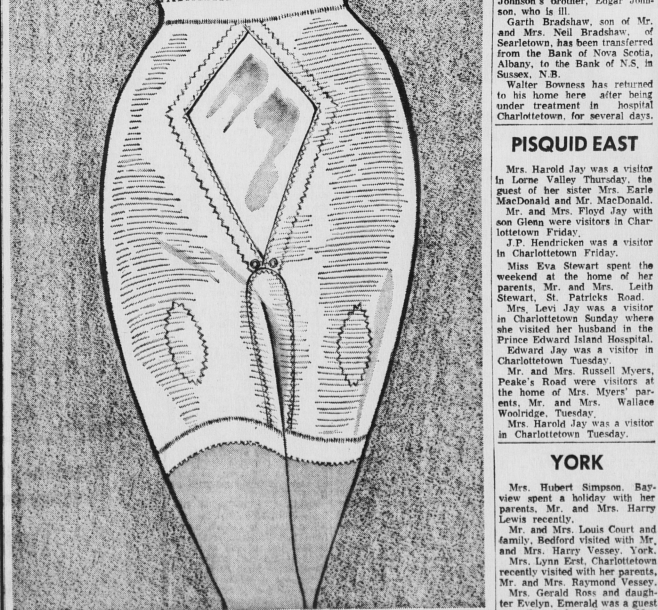


**PONY BREAKS UP ROMANCE**

# Two Papers Support Liberals In Editorials On Campaign

MONTREAL (CP)—The Montreal Gazette, which lists itself as independent Conservative politically, and has historically supported the Conservative party, Tuesday came out editorially for the Liberals in the current federal campaign. The editorial praised the work of Prime Minister Diefenbaker, and said his victory in 1958 "restored to Canada the full function of the two-party system." But it said that "as a leader and Mr. Pearson alone, win for Canada in restoring good relations with other countries, or hope and chance of forming a government, and of forming a government that would be best fitted to restore respect abroad, and to seek harmony at home."

CALGARY (CP)—The Calgary Herald published an editorial Monday supporting the Liberals in the current federal election campaign. The Herald traditionally has supported the Conservatives. The editorial says the Herald "has already made it very clear that it believes the present Conservative government must be removed from office."
