

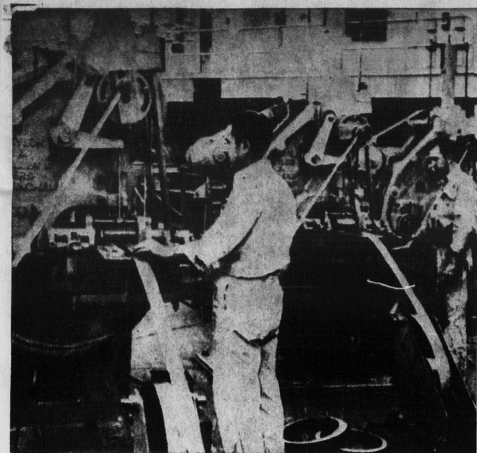
Closing Exercises Hed At Morell HS
