Big Program Is Planned On Final Day Of Carnival

Speed and motor boat racing and water sports on Summerside Harbour, the crowning of the new Sea Queen, and a big parade this afternoon are expected to attract the largest crowds of the 1958 Lobster Carnival which concludes tonight at Summerside with the serving of the lobster suppers and an evening dance. The boat racing and water sports which will be held on Summerside Harbour with registrations being made at the Yacht Club building on Holman's Wharf are scheduled to commence at 2 p.m. A number of power boats from Shediac, N.B. are expected to enter Summerside Harbour this morning in line astern formation at about 11:30 a.m. These boats will participate in the afternoon races, along with boats from many parts of Prince Edward Island.

At 3:30 p.m. the concluding parade will form on Water Street West near the Texaco Service Station operated by Jim Harris, and will proceed east on Water Street to Granville, north on Granville, to Notre Dame, and west on Notre Dame to the Civic Stadium.

The parade will include the Salvation Army Band, the Navy Band from Halifax, and the Summerside Sea Cadet Band.

At 4:40 p.m. the new Lobster Carnival Sea Queen will be crowned in a ten-minute ceremony which will be broadcast on the CBC trans-Canada radio network.

Lobster suppers will be served in the Stadium from 4 to 8 p.m. and dancing, and carnival midway activities will conclude the evening events and the 1958 third annual Summerside Lobster Carnival.
