N.Y. Stocks Leave

Everyone Guessing

NEW YORK, Aug. 24 - (AP) - The stock market opened last week with the sharpest break of the year. Thereafter it did nothing for the remainder of the week. The action left everyone guessing what would happen next.

The thing that made it so dif-ficult to assess was the lack of vol-ume. Less than 4,750,000 shares changed hands. There have been many holiday weeks of four trading days showing a higher volume.

The Monday break sent the As-sociated Press average of 60 stocks down \$1.50, a fall not exceeded since Oct. 22, 1931.

A meeting was under way in Moscow Monday between the Chin-ese Communists and the Russians. Some fear was expressed that a new phase in the Korean war was in the making.

Whether the Communists intend-ed to extend the war or agree to an armistice was looked upon as unsettling to the market.

Volume on the break came to only a little more than 1,000,000 shares, a point below the daily av-erage for the year.

A close watch was kept on volume the following day, but it never got above the million mark of the week. The AP average gained a dime Tuesday, added 20 cents Wed-nesday, another dime Thursday, and remained unchanged Friday, when it closed at \$107.50. The drop on the week was the greatest since the week ended April 19.

The five most active issues on the stock exchange last week were Southern Company with 83,500 shares traded unchanged at 14 1/2, American Machine & Foundry up 1/4 at 22 1/2, American Telephone up 1/4 at 15 1/2, Baltimore & Ohio off 1/4 at 22 1/2, and Columbia Gas off 1/4 at 14.

Canadian issues were higher Fri-day. International Nickel gained 1/4, Melroe was up 1/4, and Distillers Seagrams added 1/4. Dome Mines eased 1/4 while Hiram Walker and Canadian Pacific were unquoted. On the curb Royalite Oil gained 1/4. Giant Yellowknife 1/4 while Dome Mines lost 1/4.

U. S. Steel

CLEVELAND, Aug. 24 - (AP) - Steel magazine predicts today the government will lift restrictions on steel, copper and aluminum in the second quarter of 1953.

A drive to get rid of the Control-led Materials Plan started even be-fore the recent steel strike, the met-allowing weekly says. "Now, cop- per and aluminum demand is ap-proaching, if not already at, a bal-ance with supply, and steel has made a miraculous recovery from the strike."

Steel says the government may decide to "open end" C.M.P. in the first quarter of 1953. That would mean available controlled materi-als could be bought and sold with-out C.M.P. permission if there is open space on mill schedules at the expiration of lead time for order- ing.

The steel industry, said the mag-azine, is giving preference to mili-tary orders to such an extent that it appears those which accumulated during the strike will be filled by Sept. 30, two months earlier than the industry promised when the strike ended.

The steelmaking rate rose 2.5 points last week to 97 per cent of theoretical capacity.
