14 Injured When Stock Car Runs Into Crowd

MONTREAL, (CP)—At least 14 persons were injured Sunday, nine seriously, when a stock car going 60 miles an hour swerved from the dust track at east-end Noel raceway and plowed through a group of spectators lining a wire fence.

Most of the injured were treated on the scene, but some were taken to hospital for further treatment and observation. It was estimated 50 persons were in the area struck by the car. A crowd of 4,000 was watching the races at the track, which has no stands.

Another car behind the one involved swerved to avoid the first and turned end over end. The driver escaped injury.
