Saint John TV increases power

SAINT JOHN, N. B., (CP)—Station CHST-TV has increased its picture power on channel 4 to 100,000 watts from the original 27,000. Sound was increased at the same time to 50,000 watts from the former rating of 13,000. The power increase enables the station to reach an estimated population of 500,000 in New Brunswick, Nova Scotia and Maine, with a clearer picture in distant "fringe" areas. First television outlet in the Atlantic provinces, CHST-TV began beaming regular programs March 24 last year from its transmitter mast atop 1,550-foot Mount Champlain.
