CCPE Announces National Scholarship Program

The Canadian Council of Professional Engineers (CCPE), today announced its National Scholarship program for 1990.

The three programs available for consideration are:

- The North American Life Scholarship program which offers

three scholarships of \$7500 each annually to provide financial assistance to engineers returning to university for further study or research in an engineering related field.

- The Optimum Scholarship program which offers one schol-

arship annually in the amount of \$5000 to provide financial assistance to engineers returning to university for further study or research in a field other than engineering. The field of study chosen should favour the acquisition of knowledge pertinent to enhancing the performance of the candidate in the engineering profession.

- ENCON Insurance Managers Inc. Endowment program which offers an endowment in the amount of \$5000 annually to a professional engineer wishing to pursue studies in the area of engineering failure investigation. This area of engineering is concerned with the engineering analysis of various accidents, problems and failures related to all engineering disciplines in the industrial, manufacturing and con-

struction sectors.

These programs are administered by the **CCPE National Awards Selection Committee** to assist in encouraging excellence in Canada through the promotion of advanced studies and research.

To be eligible for the programs, a candidate must be registered as a full member of the provincial/territorial professional association/order in their province/territory of employment. Acceptance for post-graduate study by a recognized university must have been granted.

The Canadian Council of Professional Engineers (CCPE) is the federation of twelve provincial and territorial associations which collectively represent more
