## University Officer Returns To City

University officer with the Charlottetown manpower center, Edmond C. LeClair returned this weekend from Newfoundland. Mr. LeClair had been sent from this area as part of a special task force assembled by the Atlantic Regional Division of the Manpower Service to assist the staff of the Manpower Centres in Newfoundland in the monumental task of training and assembling the work force required for the Churchill Falls project in Labrador.

It is estimated that there will be a total of 9,000 jobs at the hydro-development plan, and it is quite within the realms of possibility that over 14,000 men will have to be interviewed, and a great percentage of them trained for the jobs they will carry out. Some of the training courses will be of comparative short duration. Since the work is expected to last for almost seven years, this type of training is fully worthwhile.

## Is Committed To Stand Trial

**SUMMERSIDE** — An Albert South man, Terrance Michael Collins, was committed to trial by Magistrate W. Chester S. MacDonald, QC, in Prince County Court yesterday, after preliminary hearing on the charge of forcibly breaking a prison cell with intent to escape was completed.

Witnesses heard yesterday at the preliminary hearing were Albert Gallant, jailor on duty at the Prince County jail the evening of December 15; chief jailor Stuart Berry; Summerside RCMP Constables L. S. Robbins and Eric Bishop. Joseph Edmund Perry, Miminogash, changed his election to trial by Magistrate and pleaded guilty to the charge of forcibly breaking a prison cell with intent to escape, this charge also arising from the incident on December 15. He was remanded to December 21 for sentencing. A charge of parking dangerously on the highway against William Ralph Moore, Mount Pleasant, was dismissed.

**HALIFAX (CP)** — The weather office says an intensifying disturbance near Maryland will bring increasing cloudiness, snow and rain to the district today. The precipitation which will begin as snow will turn to rain in all of Nova Scotia and parts of New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island. For this reason the heavy snowfall warnings put out earlier for Prince Edward Island, Eastern New Brunswick Counties and Lower Saint John River Valley are ended. Some clearing will take place Thursday in New Brunswick but Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island will remain cloudy. All regions will be colder than on Wednesday.
