

### Meeting Is Called At S'side On Potato Tariff Resolution

According to a decision made at the regular monthly meeting of the Summerside Board of Trade on Thursday night, a meeting has been arranged for a joint committee meeting representing the Summerside, Alberton, Crapaud and Charlottetown Boards to frame a resolution in connection with the potato tariff.

The meeting will be held on Tuesday evening in the Town Hall at Summerside.

Mr. Elric Campbell, manager of the P.E.I. Potato Marketing Board and Mr. J. Watson MacNaught, M.P., will be present to assist the committee in this matter.

When drafted the resolution will be taken back to the various boards for their approval and it will then be forwarded to the proper authorities at Ottawa.

Consideration will also be given by this committee to the advisability of having a delegation representing all the boards in the Province accompany the resolution to Ottawa.

### Two Fires Keep Kensington Dept. Busy On Week-end

Two fires kept the Kensington Fire Department busy over the weekend when they were called out on Saturday to a fire at Hamilton and again to a local blaze that they quickly extinguished.

Firemen were alerted Saturday evening about 7.30 when a barn fire at Hamilton, about four miles from Kensington broke out in the farm owned by David Ramsay. The barn was completely destroyed along with a quantity of straw, oats and some potatoes but the firemen managed to save the house and adjoining buildings which had caught fire before their arrival.

The cause of the fire is not known.

A roof fire at the residence of Joseph Watson, Kensington had the fire department out again Sunday morning about 11.30 but they quickly extinguished the blaze with no interior damage, although there was minor smoke damage.

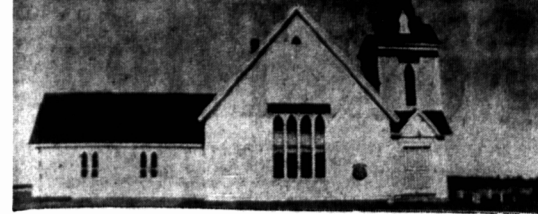
### Two Brothers Of Alma Woman In Springhill Mine
