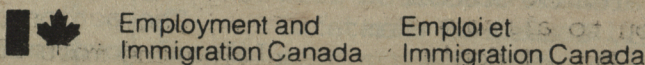

At the Canada Employment Centre on Campus, we are now involved in summer employment recruiting, among many other things. So here, outlined briefly, are some of the openings we have received to date.

**RCMP Summer Constable -**  
The Summer Student Program within the Royal Canadian Mounted Police has enjoyed five successful seasons. Students employed under this program are attached to detachments throughout the province during a period commencing in May and terminating in September. The initial week of the program is spent on orientation and training at Charlottetown. Also during this week, students are issued with uniforms as their duties for the next sixteen weeks take them into the police environment. During the summer the student will accompany a regular member of the Force on patrols to perform regular police duties. Each student is appointed a Provincial Police Constable which allows him/her to act in an official police capacity. Firearms are not worn and students do not patrol on their own. Shift work

including weekends is involved. Basic Selection Criteria is:  
Age - 19 years  
Must be a Canadian Citizen  
Have a valid Drivers' License  
Now attending University.
