Montreal Canadiens Edge Chicago Black Hawks 2-1

CHICAGO (CP) - Bernie Geoffrion's goal midway in the second period broke a 1-1 tie and sparked Montreal Canadiens to a 2-1 victory over the National Hockey League-leading Chicago Black Hawks here Sunday night.

The victory boosted the Canadiens into a tie for second place with Toronto Maple Leafs, who were beaten 6-3 by Boston Sunday night. The two teams are three points behind Chicago, which lost only its third home game of the season.

Shortly after Geoffrion's goal, Chicago's Ron Murphy put the puck in the net but referee Art Skov ruled that the Hawk had hit the puck in with his stick above shoulder height and disallowed the goal.

Gilles Tremblay opened the scoring for the Canadiens with his 15th goal of the year at 6:30 of the first period but six minutes later he was out with a knee injury.

Wings Defeat Rangers 5-3

DETROIT (AP) - Gordie Howe scored two goals and assisted on another as Detroit's Wings snapped New York's four-game winning streak with a 5-3 National Hockey League victory here Sunday night.

Howe scored his first goal in the first period, assisted on Ed Giacomin's tie-breaker early in the final period, and got his second with a little more than 10 minutes remaining.

Andy Bathgate opened the scoring with a goal at the two-minute mark of the first period. The Rangers opened a two-goal lead early in the second when Rod Gilbert and Garth Heffelfinger beat Detroit goalie Terry Sawchuk within a 17-second span.

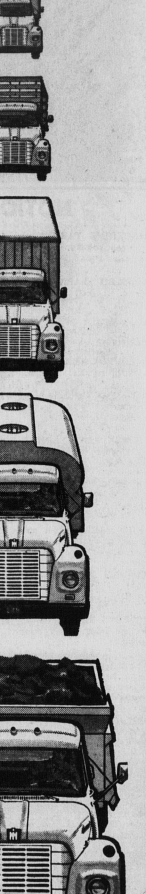
