O'BRIEN AT KINGSTON.

Assaulted With Stones.

HIS MIRACULOUS ESCAPE.

KINGSTON, Ont., May 20. William O'Brien and Dennis Kibride arrived here this afternoon. There was no demonstration made on their arrival. To-night they told their tale about the Luggacurran tent in the rink to an audience of about four hundred. An immense crowd collected outside the building and when they inside came out they were confronted by the great. When O'Brien came out surrounded by his friends the crowd yelled "here he is," and in a twinkling the stones began to fly. Sergeant Hesbitt was struck on the head, and R. J. Dardiner, a merchant, and Craig, a police officer, had their hats knocked off. O'Brien was slightly cut. He was pushed into a gateway and disappeared, which really saved him. O'Brien says his escape was miraculous, and that the attack was a deliberate attempt to murder him. He leaves in the morning for Niagara Falls.

Immense Ice Fields.

HALIFAX, May 20. The presence of such an enormous quantity of ice on the Cape Breton coast at this season of the year is unprecedented. Some of the steamers and sailing vessels which left Cape Breton ports ten days ago for Montreal have not since been heard of. Six steamers arrived in Sydney harbor today, one of which was five days making the run from Louisburg, a distance of 50 miles.

A Libel Suit.

HALIFAX, May 20. John T. Bulmer, a well-known city lawyer, who contested Cumberland at the last election with Sir Charles Tupper, as the prohibition candidate, is suing the Halifax Chronicle for \$25,000 for libel in publishing a false report of a trial which Bulmer was plaintiff.

A Big Blaze.

HOUGHTON, March 20. The business part of Lake Linder, Keweenaw County, a village of 5,000 inhabitants, was burnt to-day; loss about \$2,000,000. The only business buildings left were one saloon and small store. Over two hundred buildings were destroyed.
