Separate Systems For Data Eat Into Company's Profits

VANCOUVER (CP)—Data redundancy within an organization can eat into a company's profits, says Charles W. Neundorff, director of corporate systems and procedures for Burroughs Corp., a Detroit based manufacturer of business machines and computers.

Mr. Neundorff was here recently to speak on corporate command and control systems for management, which he described as a program aimed at increasing a company's profits by getting the right type of information to the right people so that they can effectively carry out their responsibilities.

"In many companies, data is usually collected in separate plants or isolated islands of information by the various departments," he said in an interview.

"A total management information system is designed to inter-relate these islands and encourage a free flow of information."

The first step in setting up such a system, he said, "is to precisely define the information which you require to discharge your responsibilities."

EXAMPLE GIVEN

As an example, Mr. Neundorff said, supposing one man had the parts inventory department, another the parts in process department, a third had purchase orders and a fourth had accounts payable.

"If each of us sit down and say what information we require, we will find out that we have a common requirement for the same information, but we have each acted as if we were unique and have set up our own system."

Separate systems, he said, "involved inefficiency and high cost—'plain old dollars and cents.'"

New Comet Is Visible To Naked Eye

CAMBRIDGE, Mass. (AP)—A new comet will be visible to the naked eye throughout North America for the next few weeks, says the Smithsonian Astrophysical Observatory.

The comet, named Tomita-Graber-Florida after the three scientists who first sighted it, was expected to appear as a faint point of light low in the northwest horizon shortly after sunset Wednesday night, said George Cornell, observatory spokesman.

The comet was first sighted June 6 headed toward the sun in the early morning hours.
