Third Imperial Oil Well To Be In Grand River Area

Grand River area has been chosen as the site for the third well to be drilled by the Imperial Oil Co. Ltd. on Prince Edward Island.

The actual location will be on the farm of Mr. Herman MacDougall, near Cross Roads School, a few miles east of Richmond but to the west of the Grand River.

In making the announcement yesterday, Mr. Kirkpatrick, drilling supervisor, said that the new site will be known as Imperial MacDougall No. 1 well.

The equipment, presently at site at Port Hill, will be immediately dismantled and transported to the new site. It is expected that the work will be completed within ten days.
