**DOG TAXES** — Chief of Police MacArthur reports that out of 546 people in the City who have paid dog tax, 100 of these had to receive summonses before the bill was paid. In each case this resulted in an additional cost to the owner of one dollar. The Chief states that the list of unpaid taxes is still fairly large and summonses will continue to go out until all have been paid. Citizens are reminded of the City by-law which requires the owner of a dog to report in writing to the City Clerk the ownership of such animal. Failure to pay taxes can result in a summons to Magistrate's Court and an assessment of court costs will be levied. Refusal to pay can carry a penalty of ten days in jail.

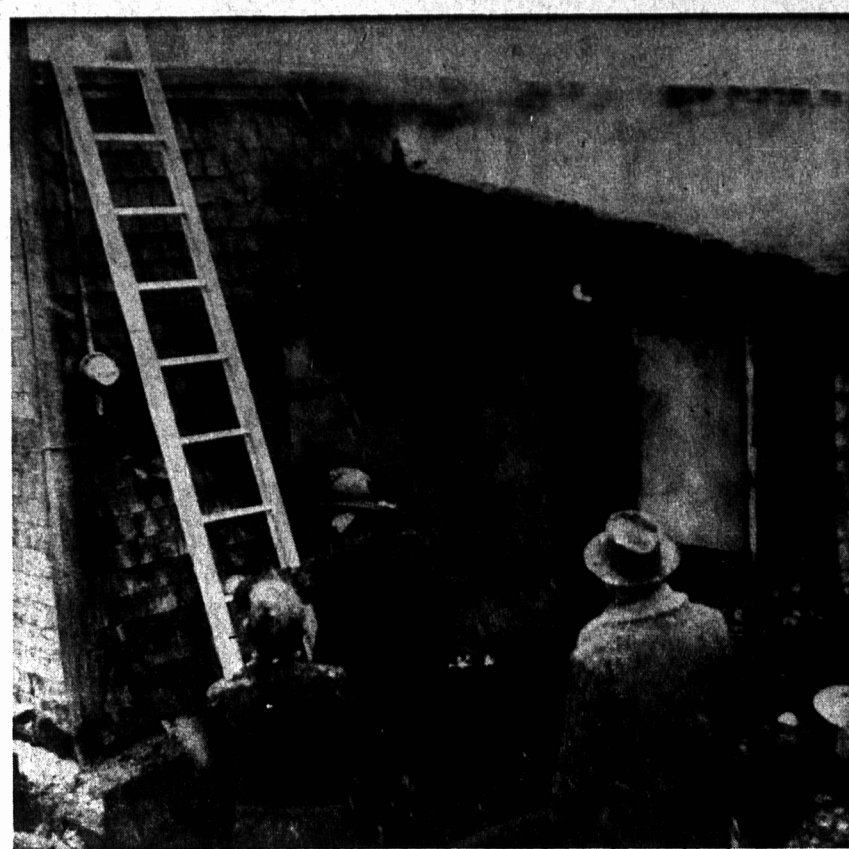

### Herd Sire Purchased By Shorthorn Breeders Ass'n

The P.E.I. Shorthorn Breeders' Association have purchased a high quality herd sire from the Saragouy Farm of Mrs. Pitfield in the Province of Quebec. His name is "Muirside Landmark". The four-year-old animal weighing 2,000 lbs. is described by a Shorthorn breeder as "the best animal of his breed that ever set foot in the province." He was purchased by Mrs. Pitfield at the "Sale of Stars" following the Royal Winter Fair in 1952, for the sum of \$4,000. The Shorthorn Breeders of Prince Edward Island have not disclosed the price paid for the animal. Clearwater lake in the Ungava district of Quebec—one of several of the same name in Canada—has an area of 478 square miles.
