Business Encouraging

Governor Louis Rasminsky of the Bank of Canada said, in effect, that the action was a recognition of existing situation rather than marking anything new in line with this comment, the increase was not taken as an indication of tighter money.

The worst that it may indicate, it appears, is continuing financial uncertainty in Canada and the United States; and, until the situation becomes clearer some uneasiness may continue. Otherwise, last week's economic developments had the wide variety characteristic of current times. The investment firm of Newbit, Thomson and Co. Ltd. says that if mid-year capital spending intentions are not adversely affected by the sales tax provisions of the federal budget, a sharp increase in actual spending will occur in the second half of the year which will provide a strong stimulus to the entire business cycle.

Comment of the American publication, Business Week, on the American scene, may have a considerable ripple effect for Canadian businessmen. "If business is a little bitles now, it's all the better for going on again in the near future. That at least is the feeling in the auto industry is scheduling it for the end of the year, for the Canadian automobile industry appears to look at the coming months.
