

SOUND LURES MOSQUITOES

WINNIPEG (CP)—A British scientist says he has developed a "sound" idea for luring mosquitoes to destruction. Dr. Peter Bellon, a neuro-physiologist with the federal agricultural department at Belleville, Ont., envisions giant tuning forks that would lure male mosquitoes. "Mosquitoes, like most insects, are attracted by sound," he said in an interview. "It merely remains to discover the proper sound." In pilot tests at Belleville, the insects were lured with a tuning fork. "All we did was find the frequency at which the male flaps her wings. We caught thousands of males that way."

BATHURST, N.B. (CP)—A 72-year-old Carquet, N.B., woman will represent Canadian mothers who lost sons or daughters in war during Remembrance Day observances at the National War Memorial in Ottawa Nov. 11. Arrangements were made by the Canadian Legion to have Mrs. Dominique Lantagne to participate in commemorative services in the nation's capital. Mrs. Lantagne now lives with her 63-year-old husband in the fishing village of Carquetou, N.B. The Lantagnes had 13 children. Three were killed and two others wounded while serving overseas during the Second World War.

Guard Injured By Prisoner

MONTREAL (CP)—A guard at St. Vincent de Paul Penitentiary was slashed across the face by a prisoner wielding a bread knife Tuesday and another inmate may lose the sight of one eye. The assailant, named Warden Michel LeCorre, was Jacques (Tarzan) Laplante, serving 12 years for manslaughter, assault and rape. The attack occurred as guards paid heed to calls following mealtime. LeCorre said the prisoner held Rousset hostage for 10 minutes after slashing him and only agreed to release the guard under guarantee.

Authorities asked to Laplante's request to be transferred to provincial police cells in downtown Montreal. Laplante is to be arraigned today on a charge of grievous assault. What sparked the attack was not immediately known.

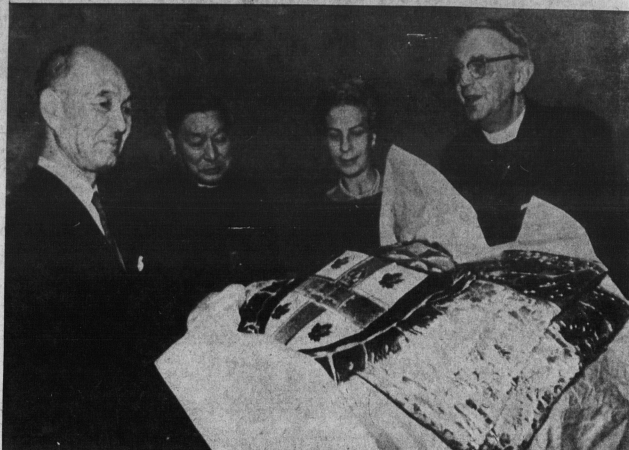

Cuban Revolutionaries To Ignore Peace Deal

MIAMI, Fla. (AP)—The Cuban revolutionary council today told the United Nations that it will proceed with armed action against the Fidel Castro regime regardless of any deal that might make with the Cuban premier. Castro does not represent Cuban national sovereignty, Council President Jose Miró Cardona said in a telegram before the UN official left on an observation mission to Havana. This may arrangements with Castro "will not detain efforts by Cubans to liberate themselves by force of arms from foreign domination," the revolutionary group declared.

U.S. Steel Corp. Cuts Dividend

NEW YORK (CP)—Directors of U.S. Steel Corp. Tuesday reduced the quarterly dividend to 30 cents from 75 cents a common share. The biggest U.S. steel producer thus became the fifth major steel company to reduce its dividend in recent months. The abandoned rate had been paid each quarter since the October-December period of 1956. Directors voted the reduction after announcing that July-September earnings plunged far below the amount needed to support the dividend. They dropped to \$26,825,489 or 38 cents a share.

Two Skin Divers Selling Cannon

BINGHAMTON, N.Y. (AP)—Two skin divers are seeking a buyer for a 250-year-old British cannon weighing nearly three tons that they recovered from the St. Lawrence River near the mouth of the river. Jack Schum, 37, a toolmaker from Harpersville, and Harold Beyer, 26, a Binghamton truck driver, are exhibiting the cannon at a lumber yard here. They found the weapon in water 35 feet deep earlier this month while searching the river bottom for old wine bottles. The cannon is 12 feet long. Its bore is 2 1/2 inches in diameter and the barrel is marked with a Tudor-rose crest and an arrow.

The Cannon was made before 1714, they said, and weighs 5,802 pounds. It is well preserved.

Health Minister Queried On Drug

OTTAWA (CP)—Health Minister Mowbray was queried on Monday on no indication Tuesday whether a ban is planned against advertising of drugs for the treatment of cholesterol in the blood stream. He told Stanley Knowles (NDP—Winnipeg North Centre) that the department is continually scrutinizing all types of drugs and certainly is on top of the situation. Mr. Knowles has his question on a statement by Dr. C. A. McNeill, director of the federal Food and Drug Directorate, who expressed concern Monday at the Canadian Society of Forensic Science that the public may accept such drugs as preventative for heart disease.

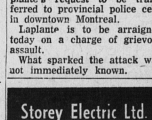
