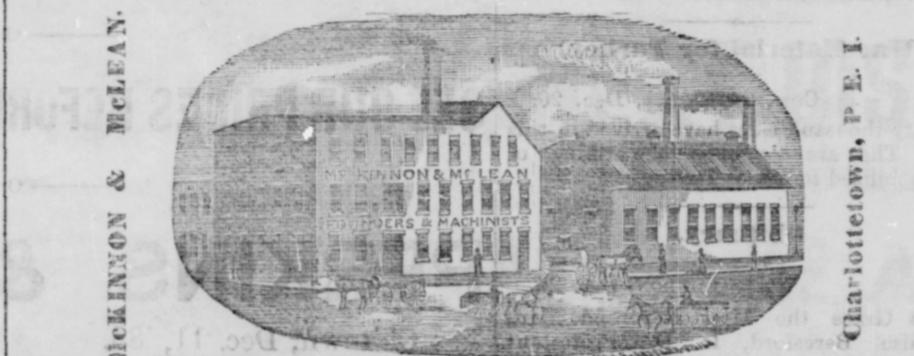

ness by Professor Mahassian, I thought

1,000). He started on October 5th,
and writing from Port Said, reports as
follows: 'Sailing on Monday, I was ill
on Tuesday night and Wednesday
morning, but quite well between the
attacks. Once more, when the weather
was very rough and the ship rolling
terribly, I felt squamish, but
two teaspoonfuls of the eucaïne put me all right.' He
adds 'I have missed only three regular
meals, but had mine at these times on
deck. Only one other passenger has
suffered less than I have; all the others
have been very ill. Other voyages I
have always been the worst on board,
and I think the eucaïne must have the
credit of the improvement. Other
letters have been received, but as no
medicines are made of any return of the
medicines, we conclude he has remained
well.'
