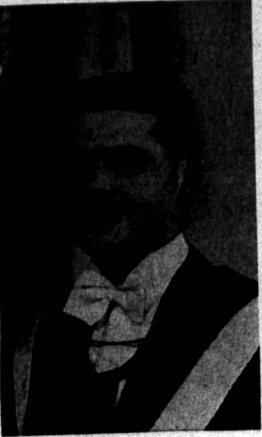

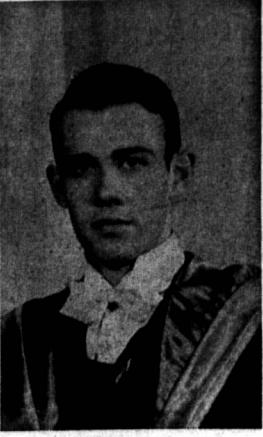

### Truman Sets Off Steam In New Blast At Eisenhower Policies

WASHINGTON (AP)—Harry S. Truman said Friday the Eisenhower administration is driving him toward socialism.

In his old "give 'em hell" style, he jumped on Treasury Secretary George Humphrey for wanting, he said, "to choke us to death with interest rates." He said administration policies are forcing the little fellow out of business.

"I'm not a Socialist," the former Democratic president said, "but they're driving me that way."

His audience was the Electric Consumers Information Committee, an organization formed by labor and farm groups and the electric co-operatives fighting for public power development.

#### HE'S ALL STEAMED UP

"You ought not to get me started on it; I'm all steamed up," Truman said when the subject of the government's atomic energy program came up.

He said the most dangerous thing facing the U.S. today is what he called an administration plan to "burn the 18 billion or 20 billion dollars of the taxpayers' money that developed the atomic energy program over to private ownership."

When the atom is developed fully, Truman said, it can be the source of all the world's power and bring the great desert areas into flower.

EDMONTON (CP)—Eight Canadians have been awarded fellowships for a new graduate program in school administration to begin at the University of Alberta in September. The new course stems from a five-year project in educational leadership sponsored by the Canadian Educational Association. Among those awarded W. K. Kellogg Foundation fellowships are Newman Kelland of St. John's, Nfld., and Malcolm MacInnes of Antigonish, N.S.
