Girl Guide News

Save these simple installment. If you're a beginner, you'll soon be able to profit from the tips given in the second part of each article.

For Experienced Players - 13. Why does North decide to add the queens and sevens (as described in the sections for beginners) to his meld? Was this a wise decision or a poor play?

In favor of melding was the principle of establishing as soon as possible a base of four (or more) natural cards. The establishment of such a base makes it possible to build a canasta, and good players therefore make a base quickly.

Against melding was the principle of keeping a goodly number of cards in your hand at all times — particularly towards the beginning of a hand. If you deplete your hand, the enemy may freeze the deck and keep you from getting the discard pile.

The decisive point in this case was the fact that North had picked up his two extra queens and his two extra sevens from the discard pile. Hence South could be presumed to know that his partner had the extra queens and sevens in his hand.

If South, acting on that knowledge, later added a seven, a queen, or a wild card to the meld, North would be able to add his held-up cards at that time. In the meantime, North could keep the sevens and queens in his hand to guard against a freeze.
